We are there <u>Week 3.</u> We ask parents to bring Scouts and their belongings to camp Arrival Sunday afternoon, we will be gathering in the Sandy Beach parking lot at 5:00 PM., Check in time to our campsite is *5:30 PM*. <u>Scouts should bring bag lunches for Sunday supper</u>.

Completed Health Forms MUST BE SIGNED by the Parent, Doctor, AND Scout!

Then turned in to the Treasurer by our Last meeting in June.

*** Health Forms Are MANDATORY ***

A health form is REQUIRED for ALL scouts AND any adult staying in camp for 24 hours or more!

Yawgoog rule: No one stays in Camp without a completed Health Form

Directions: Rte 95 South to Exit 3B (Route 138 West)

Follow Route 138 through the 1st light

At 2nd light (blinking yellow), take a right and continue on Route 138 Follow Route 138 until you see the sign for Camp Yawgoog on the left

LABEL EVERYTHING!!!!

WHAT TO BRING This is by no means a complete list, but it should help

- ** Full Scout Class A uniform (Shirt, hat, neckerchief, slide, Scout pants/shorts, Scout Belt) on a GOOD solid hanger! We will eat every evening meal in full Class A uniform (including Scout socks) and wear it all day on Sunday.
- ** Sleeping bag
- ** Insect repellent
- ** Scout Handbook, Knot Kit, Backpack
- ** Footlocker or lockable storage container (If using a keyed lock, bring extra key for Scoutmaster)
- ** Watch
- Face cloth/soap/towel / Toothbrush/toothpaste
- Comb
- Extra T-shirts (Troop 2), shorts, underwear, socks/<u>Scout Socks</u>
- Long pants (at least 1 pair)
- Sweatshirt
- Sneakers (1 good pair +1 throwaway for mud pit)

- Flip/flops or water shoes (for shower or walk to waterfront)
- Light Jacket
- Rain gear (yes it does sometimes rain)
- **- Bathing suit/towel
- **- Flashlight/Extra Batteries
- Pocketknife
- Canteen or Water Bottle & T2 Clip
- Compass
- Sunscreen
- **- Stamped post cards
- ** Scout spirit
 - ** THESE ARE A MUST

OPTIONAL

- Hiking boots
- Sunglasses
- Camera
- Fishing gear

Again, Do not forget to LABEL EVERYTHING (6 Boys in a tent, things tend to get mixed up)!!!

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Do **NOT** bring (or item(s) will be confiscated and returned after the Court of Honor on Departure Sunday):

Boomboxes, radios, coolers, bicycles, skateboards, video games. pets or cell phones. Other than flashlights, anything requiring batteries is not allowed! Scouts are <u>not allowed</u> to use their own personal program equipment, such as firearms, ammunition, archery equipment, or watercraft.

Other Items

- <u>Medication</u> Any Scout with medication must report to the health lodge with a Troop leader and health form before the troop checks in. If practical, the Scoutmaster can sign for the medication. If the medication must stay at the health lodge, the Scoutmaster will see that the Scout reports at the specified times. Medications must **be labeled with the Scout's name, and the name of the medication as well as dosage.** They must be picked up Sunday at the Health Lodge before the dress parade.
- <u>Medical Services</u> A doctor is available at camp 24 hours a day. In addition, a nurse lives at the Health Lodge. Regular "sick call" is immediately following breakfast (8:30 AM) and supper (6:30 PM)
- <u>Religious Services</u> All Scouts will attend a church service during our week at camp. Services are available in the Catholic, Protestant, Jewish and Mormon faiths.
- <u>Trading Posts</u> Trading posts are available in each camp and open at various times throughout the day to provide essential supplies, souvenirs and snacks. Make sure your Scout has enough money with him (Approx. \$30). <u>No loans or Troop advances will be given</u>. Basketry merit badge will also require about \$10 for supplies. There may be a small charge for the Leatherwork merit badge too.
- <u>Sanitary Facilities</u> Each campsite has a latrine with toilet facilities, sink, running water, soap, and paper towels. Sandy Beach has separate indoor shower facilities for Scouts and leaders.
- <u>Sleeping arrangements</u> Scouts will sleep in either 4 or 6 man platform tents. These will have bunks on which to roll out sleeping bags. Leaders will sleep 3 or 4 to a tent.
- <u>Troop Photo</u> A troop photo will be taken on Monday. Payment for a photo for each Scout is included in the camp fee.
- <u>Visitors</u> Visitors are encouraged to attend the Saturday Night show at 8:00 PM in the camp amphitheater, and on Departure Sunday the Chicken Barbecue from 11:15-12:30 (there is a charge for this.) The Dress Parade at 1:00 PM is a must see culmination of the week.
 - Camp Yawgoog asks visitors not to come to camp at any other times.
 - If a parent would like to stay overnight, please contact the Scoutmaster.
- ***Any parent is welcome to spend from one night to one week with us please contact the Scoutmaster in advance.
- <u>Taps</u> Taps is played at 9:30 PM. Campsites will be quiet following Taps.
- <u>Troop Neckerchiefs</u> Troop neckerchiefs can be purchased from the Treasurer. Each Scout should have received one free of charge. If not, one will be provided. This neckerchief is required to complete the Troop 2 Class A uniform.
- <u>Troop T-shirts</u> We urge Scouts to bring at least two Troop T-shirts to camp. Boys wear these during the day. The theory is to wear one shirt, wash it out at the end of the day, and let it dry on Day 2 while wearing the second shirt. Additional Troop T-shirts are available from the Treasurer for \$7.00. (\$8.00 for XXL)
- <u>Leaving camp</u> Camp Yawgoog rules state if a Scout must leave camp during the week for any reason, the Scout must contact the Scoutmaster and the camp office, obtain a signed card from the camp director, bring it to the Scoutmaster for signature, then present this card to the Bucklin offices. Upon return, this must be followed in reverse. This is for your Scout's protection. If he must leave with anyone OTHER than his parent or legal guardian, written permission from a parent or guardian MUST be given.
- <u>Extra Weeks</u> A Scout may choose to go to camp for more than one week. If this happens, the Scout will stay at the Baden Powell campsite, and be part of a "Troop" of other Scouts who are staying for extra weeks. This "Troop" has a Scoutmaster and is supervised the same as any other Scout troop, with two-deep leaders over the age of 21. You can make arrangements for any extra weeks through Narragansett Council.
- ****Camperships It is the policy of Narragansett Council not to refuse any Scout on the basis of inability to pay. If the cost of a week at Yawgoog is not affordable, please speak to the Scoutmaster and he will give you a campership application. This must be turned in one month before we attend camp. See the Scoutmaster for details. All inquiries will be held in the strictest confidence.
